Jenker and Carrie Koçak, with CRU ministries, stay busy looking to meet internationals and immigrants in Winter Park, Florida. They have found that

one of the best ways to meet people is by shopping at Walmart at night! Before Christmas, they met a young woman from Syria, here in the US to care for an ailing aunt. They quickly exchanged contact information and she joined them for the Christmas service at their church. They found she is a Christian and could see Jesus' love for her in that He sent to her 'friends like you'.

The Koçaks are starting a small group study at their church based on a CRU publication, "Finding Home". Winter Park is home to many internationally owned businesses with employees from the Middle East and the Koçaks are excited to be making connections.

They report that they are at 80% of their support goal with \$2400/month still needed for full support. Pray for them for this provision and pray for opportunities to connect with people as they strive to bring the Gospel to the nations within their own community.

By the way, Carrie is from Passadumkeag, Maine!!



Caleb Bermudez, Kingdom Rain, reports that leaders in South Asia are working to identify unreached town and villages while making plans to raise up missionaries to reach them. In Central Asia the Holy Spirit has been moving among young people to follow Christ. At the same time, older leaders are seeing the need to work together in unity with this generation of believers.
