8. What is the ultimate end of having assurance? What is the fruit of true assurance in the life of a believer?

BAPTISM

What an amazing moment when someone steps out and publicly proclaims Jesus as Lord, and then follows the example of Christ in water baptism! As God was overseeing the writing of His Word, He saw fit to include the record of the baptism of His Son in all four of the Gospels. Take a look at Matthew 3:13-17; Mark 1:9-11; Luke 3:21-22; and John 1:29-34 to experience (or perhaps re-experience) the glory of God as Jesus is baptized by John in the Jordan River. Recently, two people attending our local church have expressed their desire to be baptized...praise God! Both attend Bible study in our home. Please pray for them as they take this step of faith!

One of the people who will be baptized especially needs prayer. It is her heart's desire to also lead her family to the cross of Jesus where they can receive the saving grace of Christ. For many of us (myself included), it can be difficult to imagine what life might be like if we are the only person in our family who has Believed on Christ, repented of our sin, and received the gift of the Holy Spirit. Please pray for her to be courageous and to stand firm in her faith, even as she is set apart from the rest of her biological family with the decision to be a Jesus follower. In preparation for this challenge, we are compelled in our ministry to share the teaching of Jesus where He gave stern warning on the Cost of Discipleship. This can be found in the book of Luke, Chapter 14:25-33. Verse 26 is one verse in particular that can be unsettling to new believers, as well as some folks who have attended church for a time and have not been exposed to this teaching: 26 "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." Does Jesus really command us to hate our family to become His disciple? No, but our love for God must be so great that the love of family must appear to be hate by comparison.

For those of us who are attracted to word images, here is one that I believe helps illustrate the meaning of verse 26. If the love for family is equal to the highest point of Tom Sauk Mountain or Mount Katahdin, our love for God must be as deep as the Mariana Trench. There can be no comparison, no similarity in depth or scale of devotion. God is sovereign—the Creator God—and declares in His Word that He is not and will never be subservient or second place to anyone. God will not accept anything less than being the most loved, the most worshipped and adored, and the most important thing in our life. This even includes the blessing of family that He provides to help us better understand how to love Him more than anything/everything else. There is no negotiation and no compromising with the God who gives us everything, especially the hope of an eternity with Him because of the saving work of Jesus!

Please continue to pray for new Christians, as well as wisdom for us to impart these truths lovingly and succinctly as we share the plan of salvation. (This is an excerpt from Kim & Charles Redburn's latest newsletter)
